Bethlehem Township School District Summer Camps

Bethlehem Township School District will be running summer camp again this summer. The camps will run at Thomas B. Conley Elementary School and Ethel Hoppock Middle School. The first week of camp is June 17 through 21 and the second week is June 24 through 28.

- **Hoppock Half Day Morning** 8:30 am-11:30 am, **Conley Half Day Morning** 9 am-12 pm
- **Hoppock Half Day Afternoon** 11:30 am -2:30 pm, **Conley Half Day Afternoon** 12-3 pm
- Before-care 7am-9am (**Conley Camps ONLY)
- After-care 3pm-5pm (**Conley Camps ONLY)
- Please send lunch/snacks with your child as there will be a scheduled lunch time.
- There will not be any lunch or food for purchase at camp.

Camp Fees:

Camp Descriptions

Camp Name	Teacher	Students entering grades:	Location/Time Week
(SculptureCamp	Mrs. Bruen	4-9	Hoppock 8:30-2:30 June 17-21
Students will learn a number of different clay sculpting techniques and will create a new project each day. They will also get to experience using a Potter's Wheel and learn how a kiln works.			
The Play's The Thing	Mrs. O'Keefe	5-9	Hoppock 8:30-2:30 Both Weeks
The Play's the Thing will explore every aspect of the theater - acting, costumes, props, sound, set, and more! Using scripts and songs from iconic Broadway productions, campers will then create a one-of-a-kind production that showcases their skills and talents. Performing is encouraged, but not required! Campers will also get to discuss possible shows for next year!!!!			
Camp Happy Times	Mrs. Mergott	K-4	Conley 9-3 Both Weeks
Camp Happy Times offers free play time (both indoor and outdoors) and socialization and will be lighthearted and fun! Children will have the opportunity to interact with their camp-mates and play with a variety of toys/games/puzzles/manipulatives etc. We will visit the school playground as often as possible (as the weather permits), listen to stories, sing songs and just "hang-out" together in a warm and welcoming environment!			
Camp Longhorn	Mr. Boganski/Mr. Pilato/Mr. Bobal	2-6	Conley 9-3 Both Weeks
Campers will learn and engage in a broad variety of competitive and cooperative games that while focusing on character building opportunities. Games range from puzzle and inquiry-based activities focused on team-building to athletic challenges centered on fostering confidence and spatial awareness. Examples of games/challenges in which campers may participate include marble track building, capture the flag, blob tag, wolf in sheep's clothing; etc.			
Board Games	Mrs. Thompson	2-9	Conley 9-12 Both Weeks
Students will be able to hang out with friends and play board games, write comics together, read together, draw together or just sit and talk together. Scrabble, Chess, Monopoly, Sorry, etc. will be available.			
Basketball Camp	Mr. Manning	3-8	Conley 9-3 Both Weeks
This camp is designed for players who are looking to learn the basics and be introduced to the game of basketball. Campers will learn terminology, basic concepts, and gross motor movements in a positive and fun environment.			
Backyard Bonanza	Mr. Bobal/ Mrs. Lazier	5-8	Hoppock 8:30-11:30 June 17-21
Campers will learn about the importance of teamwork through the playing of backyard games. Activities will include, quoits, pickleball, basketball, and flag-football. There will also be plenty of other activities that promote team-building and working cooperatively with others.			
Movies Around the World	Mrs. Swenson	5-8	Hoppock 11:30-2:30 Both Weeks
Students will view and discuss highly-acclaimed foreign films (both features and shorts) for middle school children. This is a continuation of my very popular after-school club (with all NEW selections). A different country will be visited each day. Outside brain-breaks wading in the Hoppock Musconetcong tributary occur daily.

Little Explorers	Ms. Wellbrock	Ages 3-5	Conley 9-3 Both Weeks
Join us for fun summer days exploring at Conley School. We will learn about ocean life, camping, and take a pretend vacation! Each week we will center our activities, play and crafts around the ocean life, camping and vacation themes. Students will pick the location of our pretend vacation and we will learn about that place and transform our classroom. Children will practice following classroom routines, have facilitated play time and practice age appropriate social skills. We will play games, take turns, use our imagination and most importantly learn to get along.			
Photoshop Camp	Mrs. Bruen	5-9	Hoppock 8:30-11:30 June 24-28
Students will get to learn the basics of Photoshop and tinkercad. We will alter original photos taken by students as well as create 3D printed objects.			
Camp Makerspace	Mrs. Swenson	6-8	Hoppock 8:30-11:30 Both Weeks
Want to build a lego wall? Race paper airplanes? Write with invisible ink? Or just relax? Campers will experience various Makerspace activities including coding through Scratch games, exploring Makey Makeys, Ozobots, Microbits, reading, board games, Sharpie tie-dyeing, window graffiti, jigsaw puzzles and other surprises. Outside brain-breaks wading in the Hoppock Musconetcong tributary occur daily.			
Everything 80s	Mrs. Lampariello	6-9	Hoppock 8:30-11:30 June 17-21
Come spend a week immersed in 80s movies, shows, games, and crafts. We will be watching classic 80s movies. Some possibilities are Goonies, ET, Ferris Bueller's Day Off, Karate Kid, Footloose, Pretty in Pink, and Back to the Future. Crafts will include making tie dye shirts, lava lamps, and lanyard keychains. *Students need to bring two white t-shirts to camp.			
Movies & Crafts	Mrs. Lampariello	2-5	Conley 12-3 June 17-21
We will spend each day watching an animated movie, playing games and creating crafts centered around the movie. Movie titles may include Zootopia, Sing, Despicable Me, Finding Nemo, Toy Story.			
Mural in the Hall	Mrs. Bruen	5-9	Hoppock 11:30-2:30 June 24-28
Students will work together to create a mural for the arts hallway at Hoppock. This will give students a taste of what set design is like during the school year.			
Behind the Gridiron A Fantasy Football Camp	Mr. Hathaway	6-8	Hoppock 8:30-2:30 June 24-28
Attendees will learn about the strategy of fantasy football as well as how the business of fantasy football works. If you attend this camp, you will learn why it is best to wait on drafting a quarterback, how to use your waiver wire and make great trades, and how to dominate your fantasy football league! You will also learn about all of the skills and strategies that will help you understand how people actually make a great living off of the business end of fantasy football.
